Point Place Days is an annual celebration of the Point Place and Shoreland community that takes place during the month of June. It was the brain child of Past President of PPBA and Honorary Mayor of Point Place, the late Howard Pinkley in 1990. He was the first chairman of the parade, followed by Deb and Mark Schuster and Tom Stagner, who is current chairman for the 10th year. It takes dozens of volunteers that work on the parade and events for months. There was no parade in 2020 due to COVID, but it was back in full force last year and looking forward to another fabulous parade this year.

There are dozens of events throughout the month - something for everyone!

We have a Ligthouse Community Church Service and Picnic, Car Show, Fireworks, Concerts, Family Events, Pie Cake and Cookie Contest, and much more!

And of course, we have our fantastic PARADE!

Parade kicks off at Noon on Saturday, June 4

Summit Street will start to close down by 11:15 AM starting at Manhattan Blvd. Line up runs from Lighthouse north to 108th

Parade starts at Messiaha Lutheran Church down Summit St. to 131st St. Down 131st to 305th Friendship Park

It starts with a Classic Car Parade by Carptown Cruisers before the main Parade. The main parade follows with a flyover by Mercy Healt Life Flight.

The next Visions meeting is Wednesday, June 22nd at CrossPoint Church at 6:30 pm.


